### The Product

The Shenyin Wanguo RMB Mainland Investment Fund (the "Sub-Fund") invests primarily in RMB-denominated and settled debt securities issued in the PRC through a RQFII quota of the RQFII Holder which is a holding company of the Fund Manager.

### Risk Disclosure

- The investments of the Sub-Fund are concentrated on securities related to the PRC market. Investment in the PRC market is exposed to various emerging market risks including political, economic, regulatory, legal, foreign exchange, settlement and liquidity risks.
- The Sub-Fund invests in securities through a RQFII which is subject to applicable rules and regulations imposed by the PRC authorities. The RQFII rules are novel in nature, and their application may depend on the interpretation of the Chinese authorities. Any changes to the relevant rules may have an adverse impact on the investment of investors in the Sub-Fund.
- Renminbi is currently not freely convertible and is subject to exchange controls by the Chinese government. Investors may be adversely affected by the movement of the exchange rates between Renminbi and other currencies.
- The Sub-Fund may be exposed to risks associated with changes in PRC tax laws. Such changes may have retrospective effect and may adversely affect the Sub-Fund.
- Investment in the Sub-Fund is exposed to interest rate risk that applies to debt securities. The macro-economic policies and controls of the Chinese government will have significant influence over the capital markets in the Mainland China.
- The Sub-Fund is exposed to credit risk arising from issuers of the RMB denominated debt securities in which it invests. The Sub-Fund may invest in debt securities which are not listed. Even if the debt securities are listed, the market for such securities may be inactive. Any distributions involving payment of dividends out of the Sub-Fund's capital may result in an immediate reduction of the Net Asset Value per Unit. The Sub-Fund or the Fund Manager may amend the Sub-Fund's distribution policy with respect to payment of dividend out of the capital of the Sub-Fund subject to the SFC's prior approval and by giving not less than one month's prior notice to investors. ### Market Review

In January 2026, domestic bond yields followed an "upward then downward" trajectory. At the start of the year, a strong rally in equities and commodities pushed the 10-year Treasury yield up to **1.90%**. In mid-January, regulators raised **financing margin requirements** to cool the equity market, triggering a recovery in the bond market as major banks ramped up allocations to 7-10 year Treasuries. During this period, the central bank's rate cut via **structural monetary policy tools** caused a brief "V-shaped" volatility, though it did not significantly disrupt the subsequent recovery. As of January 31: **3-year Treasury yield:** Closed at **1.40%** (up 2BP MoM); **10-year Treasury yield:** Closed at **1.81%** (down 4BP MoM). Regarding **bond supply**, total issuance for the month reached **1,634.128 billion yuan**—comprising 689 billion yuan in Treasuries, 138 billion yuan in Policy Bank bonds, and 807.128 billion yuan in Local Government bonds. This marks a year-on-year (YoY) decrease of 1,922.822 billion yuan, a sharp decline of **54.05%**. On the **liquidity front**, the market remained generally balanced with a slight uptick in costs. The **DR001** rate rose from 1.24% at the beginning of the month to approximately 1.33%, while the **DR007** rate climbed from a low of 1.43% to 1.59%.

### Market Outlook and Strategy

Looking ahead to February, there are only 16 trading days (including 2 weekend compensatory workdays), with 11 days before the Spring Festival (including 1 workday) and 5 days after the festival (including 1 workday). Due to the limited trading window, trading volume is expected to shrink, and the market is projected to maintain a range-bound pattern characterized by "a ceiling above and a floor below." At the **policy level**, there remains room for RRR (Reserve Requirement Ratio) and interest rate cuts within the year; however, the specific timing will depend on the coordination of internal and external environments. **Fiscal policy** may become a key variable disrupting the bond market, as an increase in government bond supply and further fiscal stimulus measures could intensify market volatility and positioning. Regarding **liquidity**, conditions may tighten marginally due to the surge in cash demand ahead of the Spring Festival. Nevertheless, the People's Bank of China (PBOC) is expected to stabilize the market through tools such as reverse repos, thereby limiting the scope for any significant liquidity adjustments.

### Comments on portfolio

This month, the RQFII fund's net asset value (Class I) returned 0.50%, while the ChinaBond Composite Full Price Index (CBCFPI) increased by 0.22% for the month. The fund outperformed the index, mainly due to the strong performance of equity assets at the end of the month. As of the end of January, the portfolio held approximately 92.21% in bonds, with convertible bonds accounting for 11.28%, unchanged from the previous period. Public funds/equities accounted for 6.85%, primarily affected by a decline in market value. Most of the corporate bonds held were investment-grade. As of the end of January, the fund's average duration was 1.52 years, and the average yield to maturity was 2.16%.


