#### Market Review

During the current period, the yield on fixed term government bonds decreased first and then increased at month end. Throughout the month, it declined by 3 bps/1bps/-2bps/0bps/5bps respectively. In March, the year-on-year growth rate of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) showed a significant decline from 0.7% in February to 0.1% (Bloomberg consensus expected 0.4%). On a month-on-month basis, the CPI shifted from a 1% increase in February to a negative growth of -1%. The year-on-year decline in the Producer Price Index (PPI) narrowed from -2.7% in February to -2.8% (Bloomberg consensus expected -2.7%). On a month-on-month basis, the decline slightly narrowed from -0.1% in February to -0.1%. As of the end of March, the year-on-year growth rate of the social financing scale was 8.7% (compared to a previous value of 9.0% and an expected value of 8.5%). The monthly increase in social financing was 4.87 trillion yuan (expected value was 4.11 trillion yuan), with a year-on-year increase of 507.5 billion yuan. The total new social financing in the first guarter amounted to 12.93 trillion yuan, which was only slightly lower than the previous year. The lower growth in social financing in the first quarter of this year can be attributed to the high base of the same period last year, which was influenced by increased financing and adjustments in response to the pandemic...

#### Market Outlook and Strategy

Despite signs of gradual economic improvement, the bond market continues to trade with a preference for stimulus measures to boost the economy. In April, 10-year government bond yields continued their downward trend reaching historic lows of 2.22%. The central bank has indicated that the yield levels of long-term government bonds should align with the level of economic growth. Subsequently, 10-year government bond yields experienced a shift from rising to falling, with year-end yields rebounding to levels above 2.3%. Although there has been a slight upward movement in government bond yields, overall bond yield levels remain low.


### Comments on portfolio

In April, our RQFII Fund's NAV (I Class) changed by 0.19%, while China bond Composite Full Price Index (CBCFPI) changed by 0.17%, fund outperforming the benchmark. In terms of Fund's asset allocation, our portfolio has 85.24% in bond, 2.59% in public funds/equities, slightly increased allocation to equity assets, and 12.17% in cash/MMF. Most corporate/enterprise bonds are investment grade. By the end of March, the Fund has an average duration of 1.31 years and average yield-to-maturity of 2.00%. The Fund is adequately diversified in 23 names.
