Market Review

The interest rate cut expectations were fulfilled in this month, with a smooth 10 basis points reduction. In June, manufacturing PMI was 49, rising by 0.2%, but still remained below 50. The production index, however, rebounded to 50.3%, entering the expansion territory. Yet, new orders and new export orders remained weak. June's total social financing increment data exceeded market expectations, but the overall growth rate still hit a new low. The economy continued its recovery momentum, but downward pressure still exists. Treasury yields continued to decline, with key interest rates for 1/3/5/7/10-year tenures decreasing by 11.1 bps, 2.6 bps, 3.1 bps, 3.7 bps, and 5.0 bps, respectively, leading to an overall downward shift in the yield curve. The China bond Composite Full Price Index (CBCFPI) rose by approximately 0.18% this month, increasing from last month's 124,7194 to this month's 124,9389.

Market Outlook and Strategy

Macroeconomic data continue to remain at low levels, and the market has fully accepted the reality of a "weak reality" situation. The rapid realization of interest rate cut expectations has shifted market focus towards policy expectations. The Political Bureau meeting scheduled for late July will be an important observation point for the next round of policy intensification. In an environment of loose expectations and policy speculation, bond yields are expected to experience volatility, making short-to-medium-term bond with coupon allocations more suitable in this stage.

Comments on portfolio

In June, our RQFII Fund's NAV (I Class) increased by +1.18%, while China bond Composite Full Price Index (CBCFPI) increased by +0.18%, fund NAV outperformed the benchmark. In terms of Fund's asset allocation, our portfolio has 89.06% in bond, 0% in public fund/equity and 10.94% in cash/MMF. Most corporate/enterprise bonds are investment grade. By the end of June, the Fund has an average duration of 2.07 years and average yield-to-maturity of 0.58%. The Fund is adequately diversified in 27 names.


